How HM The Queen entertains at Windsor Castle: Treasures from the Royal Library

We are looking forward to an illustrated lecture showing us some of the finest treasures from the Royal Library. Our lecturer, Oliver Everett, CVO, is Librarian Emeritus of the Royal Library, Windsor Castle, and was formerly Assistant Private Secretary to the Prince of Wales, and Private Secretary to Diana, Princess of Wales.

Mr Everett has an extensive knowledge of the Royal Library and lectures widely in Britain and abroad. He will focus on some 45 items in the Royal Collection chosen to demonstrate its range and magnificence as well as to show the varying collecting interests of individual monarchs and other members of the Royal Family. It will be a privilege to hear from someone with an intimate knowledge of the royal collection.

The lecture will be followed by a drinks reception, which, with a repeat of last year's good weather, will be outside with a view over the river. Do please buy your places in good time so that we know how many to cater for.

Annual Meeting: Burford – Wednesday, 24th July at 4:00 p.m.
