- Register of Architects Accredited in Building Conservation (AABC), operated by AABC Register Ltd.
- <u>Directory of Accredited Conservationists</u>(opens in a new window), operated by the Chartered Institute of Architectural Technologists
- <u>Professional Accreditation of Conservator-Restorers</u> (PACR) is a professional qualification, administered by the Institute of Conservation
- <u>Conservation Accreditation Register for Engineers (CARE)</u>, operated jointly by the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) and the Institution of Structural Engineers (IStructE)
- <u>Conservation Accreditation System</u> operated by Royal Intuition of Architects Ireland
- Accreditation in Conservation Architecture scheme operated by Royal Incorporation of Architects in Scotland (RIAS)
- <u>Conservation Register</u>(opens in a new window), operated by the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA)
- <u>Building Conservation Accreditation Scheme</u>, operated by the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (RICS), for a range of professionals including chartered building surveyors and chartered quantity surveyors
- <u>Building Conservation Certification Scheme</u> operated by the Chartered Institute of Building, for roles including works supervisors, site managers, building and quantity surveyors, design coordinators and managers, project managers, construction managers, facilities managers and estates managers
