



Cycle Route 2 - Didcot

Explore the churches of Didcot in this 4.5 mile circular cycle ride that visits 5 churches.
Approximately 4.5 miles - Allow 1 hour (allowing time to stop for 10 minutes at each church)

Methodist Church, Didcot

Begin your journey at the Methodist Church. There is a regular bus to Didcot from Oxford and its surrounding towns and villages.



Did you know?

This church was built in 1903 on land donated by Lady Wantage for just one shilling - about 5p today!

St Peter, Didcot

It's just a 3 minute cycle ride from the Methodist Church to St Peter's along largely residential roads.



Did you know?

To honour the railway history of the parish, the weather vane on the roof is a GWR King Class locomotive, a nod to the original church funded in part by railway shareholders!

Baptist Church, Didcot

Another 3 minute cycle through quiet residential street to discover the Baptist Church.



Did you know?

Built in 1938, it's been extended multiple times throughout the years. In fact, to accommodate their growing needs, they even turned their main worship area 90 degrees during one renovation!

English Martyrs, Didcot

Turning left out of the Baptist Church, you'll find English Martyrs just 40 feet along the road.



Did you know?

This church is part of a vibrant Catholic community that serves both Didcot and the neighboring town of Wallingford.

All Saints, Didcot

It's just over a 1 mile cycle ride to arrive at All Saints, Didcot.



Did you know?

This church sits on a site of religious significance for over 1200 years, marked by a giant yew tree. The current building began in 1160, but has grown over time with additions like the 14th century chancel.
